What is the Nicholas Cup?

A fully-supervised camp for beginner skiers, ending with a simple ski slalom and named after Nicholas Green, a 7 year old American whose parents' decision to donate his organs saved 7 people. The first Nicholas Cup camp took place in Anzère in 2002 and is now an integral part of the Winter World Transplant Games.

Every year since then, our team has been organising a similar camp known as the TACKERS camp (www.tackers.org). We have 10 years' experience caring for transplant children from around the world. The Nicholas Cup and TACKERS pay tribute to all donor families around the world.

We supply:

- Transfers from Geneva airport or Sion train station
- Food and accommodation in the Chalet Chamossaire
(www.viamonde.com/ski/accommodation/chamossaire.php)
- Ski equipment (skis, ski boots, poles, ski helmet)
- Ski clothing (ski jacket, ski pants, ski gloves, ski goggles)
- Ski instruction by experienced counsellors
- Repatriation insurance

Activities:

The camp is not only about skiing. Dog sledding, ice skating, paragliding, sledding, swimming, arts and crafts, cake and pizza making, karaoke and fancy dress are also some of the activities enjoyed at camp. These are all included in the Nicholas Cup enrolment.

Supervision:

Our team is made up of medical professionals (transplant physician and nurses), volunteer translators and animators as well as the experienced Viamonde counsellors, who work with international school groups from around the world. Our nurses ensure that correct medications are taken at the right times.

Cost:

One child per country is free of charge (not including travel to Switzerland) and each subsequent child is CHF 500. Depending on which country children come from, some countries' transplant sporting associations subsidise participants. If you do not know your country representative, please contact us for details.
